Kathleen M Heideman is the author of *The Caving Grounds*, *A Brief Report on the Human Animal*, and *Psalms of the Early Anthropocene*. Heideman serves on the board of the Upper Peninsula Environmental Coalition: she is drawn to wild and threatened places and works to defend them.
